WHEN? The dates are on page 3 of this document.

WHERE? Löwenstrasse 20, Zürich

WHAT TIME? From 09:00 to approximately 17:00

FOR WHOM? For people with little or no previous teaching experience who wish to acquire an

internationally recognized certificate in English teaching. The course is also for

people who have been teaching English without a qualification.

It is essential to have basic digital skills (Microsoft Word, for example).

WITH WHOM? Anne Skulicz and Daniel Nadig (Accredited University of Cambridge English

CELTA trainers).

PROGRAM: Training course on modern English teaching methodology, including how to

teach vocabulary, reading, listening, grammar, phonology, speaking and writing in a student-centred and communicative way. The course includes six hours of **assessed** teaching practice with real pre-and upper-intermediate adult students.

During the course, trainees have to complete four written assignments.

The final grade is based on both the teaching practice grades and on the four

assignments.

CERTIFICATE: Upon successful completion of the course, you will receive a Cambridge English

CELTA certificate, issued by Cambridge English. The qualification is valid for life.

FEES: CHF 3,500.00

WHY FT? Flying Teachers has been organizing CELTA courses since 2002 and the school

The application process and pre-course work:

- 1: Please complete the enclosed application form by hand and send a scanned copy to **teachertraining@flyingteachers.com**. It is always a good idea to keep a copy of the document.
- 2: If the application and writing tasks are considered suitable, you will be invited to an information session/interview with your future course tutor. The information session aims to provide you with some essential information about CELTA and it also includes a one-to-one interview. In addition, it will give you the chance to see the school premises.
- 3: If you and the course tutor consider that CELTA is the right course for you, you will be asked to sign a course contract and you will receive an invoice that must be paid within 20 days. It is only after these two procedures (contract and payment) that your participation in the course is confirmed. To prevent last minute changes, this is generally done one month before course start date.
- 4: Within four weeks of course start date, cancellations and refunds will not be possible. Please read the course conditions you will find at the end of this document.
- 5: The pre-course preparation stage involves:
 - Completion of pre-course work after you get access to the Flying Teachers CELTA platform. This is done about three weeks before the course start date.
 - The pre-course mandatory reading is the book **Learning Teaching by Jim Scrivener**, MacMillan Books for Teachers. The cost of the book is **not** included in the course fee.
- 6: The course is offered on a "first come, first served basis", but we recommend that you should send your completed application at least two months before the course start date.
- 7. Before you register for the course, please remember: Former trainees highlight that they spend on average six hours for planning each lessons that they teach to real learners. This amount of time needs to be taken into consideration by future trainees.
- 8. Last but not least: We have guided hundreds of trainees, from a variety of origins, ages and professional backgrounds in all these years. We run courses with a small number of trainees to give you the best possible support. So come to Flying Teachers and make sure you will pass your CELTA course.

Part four: WRITING TASK

This task must be handwritten and please include the word count. Please write an email to the tutors of the course detailing:

- The reasons why you would make an effective English Language Teacher (about 150 words). Include what you know about the teaching of English as a foreign language.
- The reasons for and feelings about taking the course, including:
 - What you know about the CELTA programme (course content and assessment)
 - What you know about teaching practice
 - o How you will deal with the intensive programme
 - How you cope with feedback and action plans
 - Include some information about your own level of language awareness and what you will do to improve this (about 250 words)



CELTA course conditions

- The course is offered on a first come, first served basis. We advise candidates to apply for the course at least two months before the course start date.
- All applications will be reviewed and you will be asked to attend an interview if your application
 meets the Cambridge criteria. After the interview/information session, you will be asked to pay for
 the course.
- CANCELLATION: You may cancel your place on the course up to four weeks prior to the course start date at no cost to yourself. Cancellations made within 2 weeks of the course start date will result in payment of 100% of costs.
- In the event that you do not complete the course or pass the course, your payment will not be refunded.
- Future employment with Flying Teachers is not guaranteed.

CELTA cancellation or withdrawal during the course policy

The full amount is due four weeks prior to the course and cancellations will not be accepted without penalty after this time.

ILLNESS

- 1. In the event of unforeseen illness or bereavement before or during the course leading to the postponement of my participation in the course, I must inform Flying Teachers immediately and provide a doctor's certificate. The doctor is determined by Flying Teachers (*neutrale Vertrauensperson*) and the visit is to be paid for by the applicant. Pregnancy and related nausea are not considered as "unforeseen illness".
- 2. If the doctor's certificate proves the illness as well as its unpredictability, I have the opportunity to participate in the next available CELTA course at Flying Teachers, however I must **reapply and my reacceptance** is **not guaranteed**. In order to participate in the next course, I must have recovered from the illness and be fit to undertake the course. This opportunity is only offered once and is subject to an additional fee of CHF 1000.
- **3.** In the event that I join a second course and fall ill again, I understand that Flying Teachers reserves the right to deny me the opportunity to reapply without refund.

MISC

- **1.** If you have to cancel your participation within four weeks prior to the course start date, Flying Teachers will charge you a penalty as follows:
 - 50% of the course fees within 4 weeks of course start
 - 100% of the course fees within 2 weeks of course start
- 2. I understand that I will not pass the course if I do not attend it on a daily basis and meet all the requirements as set forth by Cambridge English.
- **3.** I have read and I accept the Flying Teachers **CELTA course conditions** and **CELTA cancellation or withdrawal during the course policy** as stated above.

- We have been offering supported teaching practice for new CELTA graduates since 2003. The
 aim is to provide our CELTA graduates with an opportunity to acquire teaching experience in a
 supported environment. The trainees teach groups of adult learners using a coursebook,
